### TWO NEW BOARD NOMINEES WOULD BRING EX-IM BANK TO FULL POWER

A few days after announcing his support for a more effective Export-Import Bank, President Trump nominated two new members to the Bank Board that, if confirmed, would allow the Bank to field a quorum and restore Ex-Im to full operational status.

The Ex-Im Bank assists U.S. companies with financing the export of U.S. goods and services to international markets. A portion of cargo generated by the Bank is required to be transported aboard U.S.-flag ships. For transactions above \$20 million, 100% of all cargo financed by the Bank must be carried on US-flag vessels. The Ex-Im Bank helps create jobs in this country and turns a profit at no cost to taxpayers.

However, two vacancies on the Ex-Im Board prevented the Bank from fielding a quorum which blocks the Board from approving loans over \$10 million. Ex-Im opponents had prevented the vacancies from being filled over the past year. But the President's newly announced support for the Bank and the nomination of the Board members bodes well for a fully functioning Ex-Im Bank that will help generate cargoes for U.S.-flag bottoms.

The President's two nominees to the Board late last week included Alabama Republican Spencer Bachus. Bachus supported the Ex-Im Bank during his service in Congress from 1993 to 2015. The other nominee was New Jersey Republican Scott Garrett, also a former Congressman. However, Garrett voted against the reauthorization of the Bank in 2015 and once said that Ex-Im "embodies the corruption of the free-enterprise system." He has been nominated to lead the Ex-Im Board and is likely to face opposition from some Senators, especially Democrats, on his path to confirmation.

#### FRC REVIEWS FINANCES, FORWARDS REPORT

A six-person rank and file Financial Review Committee spent 3 days at M.E.B.A. Headquarters this week poring over the Union's financial records for calendar year 2016. The FRC was created as a Democratic safeguard adopted by the M.E.B.A. in the mid-1990s to examine union finances from the previous year.

This year, the Committee was made up of the following six members: Ray Collector (Houston - Chairman), Scott Adler (NY/NJ-Alternate & Recording Secretary), Tom Eastwood (Norfolk), Tom Stenquist (Oakland), Joe Salas (Seattle) and Ed Figelski (Tampa). The Committee signed off on a report that will be made available and voted upon at the May membership meetings.

# AFL-CIO CALLS 'BUY AMERICAN' ORDER A "GOOD FIRST STEP"

AFL-CIO President Richard Trumka was encouraged by an Executive Order signed this week that could signal changes to a temporary visa program used to replace American workers with cheap foreign labor. The order could also be used to multiply purchases of American products in federal contracts. Trumka called it "a good first step toward making Buy America provisions more effective and discouraging excessive waivers." However, he said that "more needs to be done to pivot the U.S. economy toward steady wage and job growth."

"Although short on specifics," he continued, "today's order addresses critically important issues. With respect to immigration, the labor movement consistently has called for reform, rather than expansion, of temporary work visa programs that make U.S. and foreign workers more vulnerable to discrimination, displacement and exploitation. A serious look at the impact of these captive-work programs on rights, wages and working conditions is long overdue. It's crucial that working people's experiences inform efforts to crack down on employer fraud and abuse. The labor movement will continue to push for trade, procurement and immigration reforms that unite and empower communities, while protecting the rights, dignity and livelihoods of all working people."

# 3-DAY QUALIFIED ASSESSOR CLASSES ADDED TO 2017 CMES SCHEDULE

# PARTICIPANTS SOUGHT FOR M.E.B.A. INLAND CONFERENCE

Organizers are seeking participants from key inland bargaining units for an upcoming one-day meeting at the Calhoon M.E.B.A. Engineering School in June. The meeting will bring together M.E.B.A. members working at various ferry operations, tug and barge outfits and other inland bargaining units. This "Inland Transportation Coalition" (ITC) will discuss matters of mutual concern, such as contract negotiations, grievance resolution, union administration and other important issues. Conference organizers are reaching out to officials around the country to identify inland members who want to get involved and can represent their bargaining unit at the meeting which will take place on June 14, 2017.

ITC bargaining units include the Alaska Marine Highway System; Black Ball Transport; Boston Marine Transport; City & Borough of Juneau; Connolly-Pacific; Delaware Pilots' Association; DMC Marine (DonJon), DRBA (Cape May-Lewes Ferry); Foss Maritime (SoCal); Golden Gate Ferry; Governors Island Ferry; King County Ferry; Lamont-Doherty; Samson Tug & Barge; Staten Island Ferry; Washington State Ferry; and the Woods Hole, Martha's Vineyard, Nantucket Steamship Authority. The groups within the ITC represent one third of the M.E.B.A. membership.

### NAVY BANS VAPING ABOARD SHIP

As of May 14, the Navy will ban the use of "Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS)" (ecigarettes) aboard aircraft, submarines and ships including Military Sealift Command vessels. The prohibition applies to Sailors, Marines, MSC civilian mariners and any personnel working on or visiting those units. The policy was put in place after several injuries occurred when e-cigarette lithium-ion batteries exploded during use or while charging. The prohibition will remain in effect until a final determination can be made following a thorough analysis.
